

## The Classic Cozy Cowl

### Crochet Pattern

#### Materials

- Hook – 5.50 mm
- Yarn – Medium weight 4  
(Red Heart Roll with it Sparkle was used in this photo)
- \* 150 grams
- Scissors
- Yarn needle
- measuring tape to measure your head circumference

#### Stitch Legend

- Rnd* – round
- st(s)* – stitch(es)
- ch(s)* – chains(s)
- sl st* – slip stitch
- DC* – Double Crochet
- FPDC* - Front Post Double Crochet
- BPDC* - Back Post Double Crochet
- \* - repeat

### Take your Measurements

Measure the circumference of your head and then add a few inches for ease.

\* For this cowl, I measured 22 inches and then added an additional 3 inches so that the cowl will fit loosely over my head and around my neck. Therefore, I am chaining up to the length of 25 inches or 63.5 cm which, for my gauge is 100 chains.

## Pattern

Begin with a slip knot on your hook and ch 100 to begin. Then sl st to the very first chain to join your work into a circle. We will now continue working in the round.

### Rnd – 1

- Ch 3 (this will count as a DC)
- Into the next ch and every ch of this round, place 1 DC
- sl st to the top of the ch 3 to join your rnd (You will have **100 stitches** in total and this should be your st count for every rnd of this project)

\* For a more finessed look, place your sts into the back bumps of your chains

### Rnd - 2

- Ch 3 (this will NOT count as a st in this round)
- into each of the next 5 sts place a FPDC (You are working the st around the post and not into the top loops.)
- into the following 5 sts, place a BPDC
- Repeat this pattern to the end of the round \*(5 FPDC, 5 BPDC)

Front Post Double Crochet pushes the post forward    Back Post Double Crochet pushes the post back



Once you come to the end of your rnd, you will notice that you had enough sts for 4 BPDC. To finish your rnd, you will ignore the ch 3 we did at the beginning and you will place a regular DC into the st the ch 3 comes out of. Then you will sl st to the top of the first actual FPDC to join your rnd. Rnd 2 is complete.

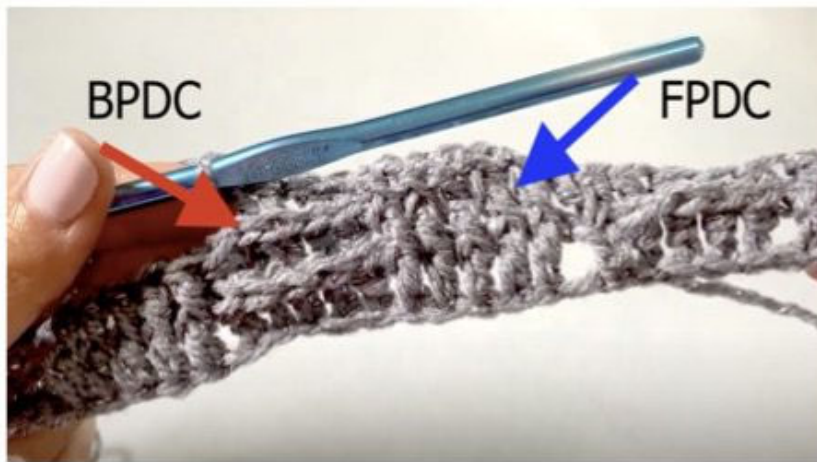


**Rnd - 3**

- Ch 2 and place 1 FPDC around the post of the st you sl st into



- Place 1 FPDC around the next 4 sts and mimic what you see from the round below. For example: place FPDC stitches around FPDC sts from the previous rnd and then place BPDC sts around BPDC sts of the previous rnd.
- \* 5 FPDC, 5 BPDC \*Repeat to the end of the rnd.
- sl st to the top of the very first FPDC st to join your round



**Rnd - 4 → 47**

\* repeat Rnd 2 & 3

Once you have completed Rnd 47, snip your yarn and fasten off. Weave in any ends.
