

Crochet Rope Rug

Crochet Pattern

The rug in this pattern measures 24" X 12" (61 X 30.5 cm). You can use this pattern and construction method to create any desired size you choose.

Materials

- Hook – 6.0 mm
- Yarn – medium weight 4 (approx 300 - 350g)
 - Bernat Handicrafter cotton was used for rug pictured above with two strands held together
- measuring tape
- 1 spool of 50 yd macrame cotton cording (4mm diameter) Cut into strips of 29" or 73.5cm. (You will need at least 32 strips)
- Scissors
- Yarn needle

Stitch Legend

- R* – Row
- st(s)* – stitch(es)
- ch(s)* – chains(s)
- SC – Single Crochet
- * - repeat

Pattern

Begin by tying a knot at the ends of each strip of cord to prepare your strips to be crocheted into the rug.

Then take your yarn with two strands held together and place a slip knot on your hook.

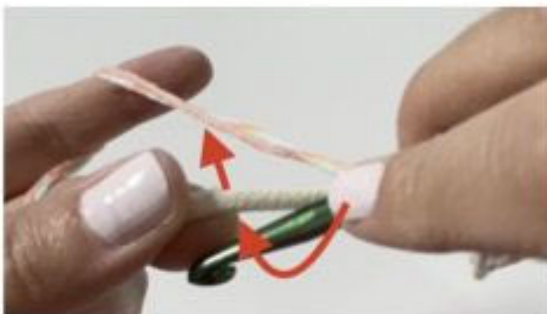


R – 1

- Place your first cord strip on top of your working yarn and just under your slip knot, then chain 1 to trap your cord in your yarn.



- using SC stitches you will work your first row by always reaching under the rope to pull up a loop in order to single crochet.



- Continue to place SC stitches across the rope until you reach the knot on the other end. I was able to fit 85 sts on mine. Depending on your gauge, you may fit more or less. It will also vary if

you choose to create a larger size rug with a longer length. It's recommended that you not place too many stitches on this first row as your work will bunch and ripple. The sts should be even and relaxed across the strip.



- at the end of R-1, ch 1 and turn your work

R - 2

- pick up the next cotton cord strip and place it between your ch 1 and your working yarn
- insert your hook into the first st and SC to trap the cord into row 2
- continue to SC across the row while trapping the cord with every st
- at the end of the row, ch 1 and turn. You should still have 85 sts.



R - 3 -> 32

*Continue repeating Row 2 for subsequent rows until you reach your desired width. I completed 32 rows for my measurements.
