

The Extended Triple Crochet Stitch

Crochet Pattern

Materials

- **Hook** : size it to match yarn weight
 - **Yarn** : any weight yarn
 - **Scissors**
 - **Yarn Needle**

Stitch Legend

- *R* – row
- *st(s)* – *stitch(es)*
- *ch(s)* – *chains(s)*
- *sl st* – *slip stitch*
- *ETC* – *extended triple crochet*
 - * - repeat

Pattern

Begin with a slip knot on your hook and ch to your desired length. For this sample, I am chaining 10. Once you have your desired length, ch an additional 4. This will represent the height of an Extended Triple Crochet stitch.



R – 1

- Into the 6th ch from the hook, you will place your first ETC

- begin by yarning over your hook twice

- then insert your hook into that 6th ch and pull up a loop (you will now have 4 loops on Your hook)

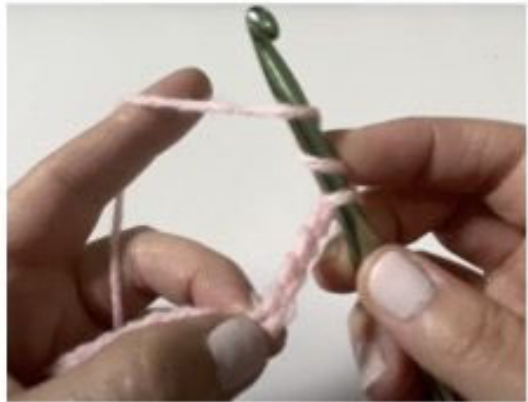
- yarn over and pull through the first loop only (you will still have 4 loops on your hook)

- now, yarn over again and pull through two loops (you will now have 3 loops remaining on your hook)

- then yarn over and pull through the next two loops (you will have 2 loops remaining on your hook)

- finally, yarn over and pull through the final two loops on your hook.

You have completed your first Extended Triple Crochet stitch!



- Continue to repeat this to create a full row of this stitch



You will have a **total of 10 sts** at the end of this row and every row from here on in this sample.
At the end of each row, chain 4 and turn your work.

*Repeat Row 1 for as long as you'd like your project to be.
