

The Primrose Stitch

Crochet Pattern



Materials

- Hook – any desired size
- Yarn – whichever weight matches your hook size
- Scissors
- Yarn needle

Stitch Legend

- R* – Row
- st(s)* – stitch(es)
- ch(s)* – chain(s)
- SC* – Single Crochet
- DC* – Double Crochet
- HDC* – Half Double Crochet
- SK* – skip
- ** – repeat

Pattern

This stitch is created using a chain in multiples of 3 + 2. For this sample I chained 21 + 2 = 23. Begin with a slip knot on your hook and ch 23 to begin.

R – 1

- Into the 3rd ch from the hook, place 1 SC, ch 2, place 1 SC back into that same st
- sk the next 2 sts and into the next st place 1 SC, ch 2, 1 SC*

* continue to repeat this to the end of the row until you have 2 sts left

- sk the next st and into the last st, place 1 HDC
- Ch 3 and turn your work

Row one is complete = 7 "peaks"

R - 2

- place 3 DC into the first ch 2 space, then repeat this into every ch 2 space to the end of the row
- at the end of the row you will have a ch 2 that you began the previous row with, so into the top of that ch 2 you will place 1 DC
- Ch 2 and turn. You should still have 23 sts **Row two is complete = 7 "shells"**

*Continue repeating Row 1 & 2 for subsequent rows until you reach your desired size.

*Note: Row 1 always has a ch2 on one end and a HDC on the other. Row 2 always has a ch 3 on one end and a DC on the other.
